What better way to celebrate our beautiful mountain environment than enjoying Martis Camp for Thanksgiving dinner? Cheer as we turn on the holiday lights at the Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony. Ring in the holidays with celebrations for Christmas, Chanukah, and New Year's at The Camp. From our family gatherings to plated dinners, there is no better place to create holiday memories and traditions.

Stop by the Family Barn for our annual Winter Festival Days from December 26th to January 2nd, offering everything from snowshoe tours to ski films, stargazing, the annual Member Holiday Party, fireworks, and scenic sleigh rides around The Camp. Also, save time to drop by the Art Loft and Folk School where programming continues to cultivate imagination, creativity and expression through hands-on learning for all ages. The opening of Lookout Lodge and the Martis Camp Express Lift on Saturday, December 12th, offers members access to some of the best ski and board terrain in the Tahoe Basin (weather and conditions permitting). From 7:00 am to 5:00 pm daily, call us at (530) 550-6090 to have the Martis Camp Ski Shuttle pick you up anywhere on property and transport you to Lookout Lodge. Lookout Lodge Ski Manager Jeff Sarlo and his team have ski, board and boot storage and ski tuning available from Friday, November 27th. As with last year, the lower parking lot at Lookout Lodge is the location for ski, board and boot drop-off and pick-up. Please note that this season we will not be storing guest skis, boots and boards overnight, so we kindly ask you to have guest equipment reloaded into vehicles after your day on the mountain. With regard to Family Guests, we can store their equipment alongside member storage for a modest nightly charge.

While our Martis Camp home continues to grow, so too does our commitment and connection with the broader Tahoe community. The Martis Camp Community Foundation (which is now fully member-managed) remains an ally for supporting nonprofits in the area. Appropriate guest use fees apply, and will be billed automatically to the member's account for unaccompanied guest access. Please contact our Concierge to arrange for a House Guest card and to make special arrangements.
