

GUEST POLICIES

All guests must be accompanied by the sponsoring member. Extended Family Guests and other guests may not host guests.

During weekend and holiday periods as designated by the Club (including December 24th -January 1st, January 14th – 16th, February 18th – 25th) the total number of guests, other than Extended Family Guests, that a member may host at one time shall not exceed the number of persons in such Member's immediate family plus one (a couple may host a couple, a family may host a family) unless approved in advance by the General Manager. Guest fees shall be charged for any additional guests approved by the General Manager.

Members may sponsor a non-member House Guest who is temporarily residing in a Martis Camp home, with a House Guest card for use Monday – Friday only. Members are responsible for registering their guests, obtaining House Guest cards and paying applicable guest fees prior to allowing their House Guests to use the Club Amenities.

To obtain privileges for a House Guest, the sponsoring Member must register House Guests with the Camp Concierge. Unaccompanied House Guests are not permitted to use the Club amenities during weekends, holidays and peak periods. House Guest cards, charged to the sponsoring Member account, will be issued at \$100 per guest family for the week, Monday – Friday. House Guests are subject to additional daily use fees which also will be charged to the sponsoring Member account. House Guests are responsible for all other charges.

The maximum term for a House Guest is two weeks. Registered House Guests may not host guests when using Club amenities.

RESERVATIONS REQUIRED

Events requiring reservations are marked with the icon shown above. Unless otherwise noted in the event details, reservations can be made through the contact details noted on that page or at the start of that section.

CANCELLATION POLICY

To cancel a reservation for a Signature Event or dining event, contact the Camp Concierge at least 48 hours prior to the event. Cancellations made with less than 48-hours notice will be charged \$25 per person. No-shows will be charged in full for their assumed participation.

Combined funding from the MCCF and other organizations provided housing assistance for 19 families, and averted displacement/homelessness of 34 children.

Girls on the Run

A grant from the MCCF provided an outdoor education and science program to all fifth graders in the Tahoe Truckee School District. Thirteen classes attended two- and three-day fall programs at Sagehen Creek Field Station, and the program continued in the spring with additional one-day sessions.

Funds granted by the MCCF helped Truckee Community Christmas provide food, coats and toys for 424 children, 342 adults and 147 seniors – making it a warmer and happier holiday season for more than 900 people.

Here are a few stories about where MCCF grants have been awarded and applied in the past year - with great success!

Big Brothers Big Sisters

Through funding from the MCCF, Big Brothers Big Sisters has continued matching children and youth with adult mentors in our area. Matches here average 43 months – much higher than the 28-month national average. Kids who are mentored have improved self-confidence and school performance. The Town of Truckee Police Department is an active mentoring partner of the program.

Family Resource Center of Truckee

Funding from the MCCF covered program expenses so 53 girls in the 3rd-5th grades could participate in Girls on the Run.

Sagehen Outdoor Education Program

Truckee Aquatics Center

Stop by and see your donations at work in this thriving new community center with a 10-lane lap pool, warm pool and water slides. Don't forget your swimsuit!

Truckee Community Christmas

Truckee/North Tahoe Emergency Warming Center (EWC)

The MCCF granted \$5,000 to the EWC. In its first season, the EWC provided winter necessities for 30 people, and 115 overnight stays for 24 individuals, one family and four dogs. This was possible through 150 EWC volunteers giving 850 hours.

The MCCF proudly awarded this year's Denise Martinez Scholarship to Truckee High School graduate Karina Nuñez. Karina achieved a 4.29 GPA, ranked 10th in her class, and played varsity basketball, softball and volleyball. In her free time, she founded a nonprofit organization that fosters relationships between youth and elders in the Tahoe community. Karina is now a freshman at UC Berkeley, focusing on social justice and advocacy with the goal of attending law school. MCCF Board Member Nicole Bailey adds, "Karina is even more impressive in person – and her parents are SO proud!" Martis Camp and the MCCF wish Karina the best of luck in pursuing her dreams.

SAFETY AND SECURITY AT YOUR SERVICE

Speed Limit

To ensure the safety of people, pets and wildlife on our roadways, the speed limit throughout the community is 25 miles per hour, and 15 miles per hour when approaching the Gatehouse and roundabouts. To avoid sliding, speeds should be further reduced when ice or snow is present.

Low-Speed Vehicles

Prior to the use of a low-speed vehicle on Association property, the homeowner must register the low-speed vehicle with the Association. An Association representative from the Gatehouse shall review the low-speed vehicle for compliance with the rules and regulations governing use of low-speed electric vehicles. The Low-Speed Vehicle Agreement form is available at martiscamp.com/gatehouse.

Transponder Access

A transponder is a small electronic device that works in conjunction with the Gatehouse Security Access System. This device transmits a signal upon approach to the Gatehouse that automatically opens the member gate for easy access. Additionally, this device announces the name of the homeowner or family member to which each transponder is assigned.

Transponders are \$50. There are three types of transponders that can be used: windshield, headlamp and portable. If you currently own a portable transponder that is not working, please contact the Gatehouse to update it.

Guest Access

All guests must be authorized for access with the Gatehouse prior to entrance into the community. Homeowners may call or email the Gatehouse with guest information (name, number in party, duration of stay). Guests may be registered on a homeowner's permanent quest list for recurrent access. Should a homeowner's quest not be listed, the Gatehouse will make every attempt to contact the homeowner to confirm authorized access before turning any guest away.





Mail Service

The House Watch Program enrollment form is available at martiscamp.com/gatehouse.



Mail service is available for all members at the Mail Room in the Camp Lodge. To receive mail and parcel delivery through the USPS, a mail delivery application must be picked up from, completed and returned to the Camp Concierge to give to the Postmaster. Mail sent to mailboxes that have not been activated will be returned by the USPS. Please note, Martis Camp ambassadors cannot check mailboxes for members. All mail forwarding, holds, etc. must be processed through the United States Post Office directly.

Please note, FedEx and UPS packages will only be accepted at the Gatehouse for members enrolled in the House Watch Program. Members enrolled in the program will subsequently have their packages delivered to their residence. Members enrolled in the Alarm Monitoring Program may have their packages delivered to their address for an additional \$10 per month.

House Watch Program

The House Watch Program offers homeowners peace of mind while away from their residence. The program is \$60 per month, billed guarterly to the member account. The program provides regular interior and exterior home inspections with immediate notification to homeowners of any issues or concerns. Key features of the program include:

- Regular interior and exterior home and property inspections Key management
- Guest/contractor/vendor/maintenance access management • Home arrival and departure services
- Home inspection after significant weather or other natural event Complete package delivery service



Alarm Monitoring & Response

The Alarm Monitoring & Response enrollment form is available at martiscamp.com/gatehouse.

Alarm Monitoring & Response offers homeowners 24-hour alarm monitoring by Gatehouse staff. The program is \$30 per month, billed quarterly to the member account. Staff will respond to a home upon any alarm notification. Response efforts are considered to be in an "observe and report" capacity. Any action taken is to assist the homeowner, local law enforcement and rescue crews. Medical or fire alarm responses consist of stabilization or preventative efforts. Additionally, Alarm Monitoring & Response helps reduce or eliminate false alarm response by police and fire agencies. Alarm Monitoring & Response is its own program and is not associated with the House Watch Program. Gatehouse staff cannot legally respond to an alarm at a home unless the homeowner is signed up for Alarm Monitoring & Response. Key features of the program include:

- 24-hour alarm monitoring
- Immediate response to any home alarm
- Local response agency assistance
- False alarm reset
- Scheduling and performance of weekly alarm testing
- Homeowner notification of system tests or service disruption
- Package delivery available at additional cost of \$10 per month




